College; Th.D., University of Zurich, Switzerland; M.A., University of Michigan; now professor of Theology and Philosophy at Goshen College, Goshen. Pegis, Anton; A.B., A.M., Marquette University; Ph.D., University of Toronto, Canada; taught at Marquette and Fordham Universities; now professor of the History of Philosophy and Head of the Pontifical Institute of Medieval Studies at Toronto.
